(pubs and restaurants)

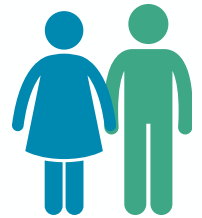


583 off-sales premises

Scottish Liquor Licensing Statistics 2021-22.

In Glasgow, **21% of people** drink above the Chief Medical Officers' low-risk guidelines.

This includes **15% of women** and **27% of men.**



This compares to **23% of people** in Scotland who drink above the guidelines.

Scottish Health Survey.



Parental drinking was a concern identified for **14% of children** on the child protection register in Glasgow.

Children's Social Work Statistics 2021-22.

29% of S2 and S4 students in Glasgow drink alcohol.

13% of S2 and S4 students in Glasgow drink alcohol at least once a month.



Health and Wellbeing Census Scotland 2021- 2022.

There were **6,264 alcohol-related hospital admissions** in Glasgow in 2021-22.

Alcohol related hospital statistics 2021-22.

The admission rate was higher than for Scotland as a whole.

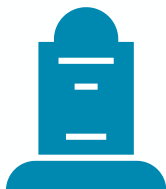

In Glasgow, **202 people** died because of alcohol in 2022, from conditions solely caused by alcohol.

The death rate was higher than for Scotland as a whole.

Alcohol-specific deaths 2022.



The **true number** of alcohol deaths is **over 3 times as high** when including conditions such as cancer and cardiovascular diseases.

NHS Health Scotland.

Every year, alcohol costs Glasgow **£364.79m** or **£615 per person.**

This includes:

Health service	£40.17m
Social care	£56.06m
Crime	£152.12m
Productive capacity	£116.43m
