There are **104 places** to buy alcohol in the Orkney Islands:

66 on-sales premises
(pubs and restaurants)



38 off-sales premises
(supermarkets and shops)

Scottish Liquor Licensing Statistics 2021-22.

In the Orkney Islands, **22%** of people drink above the Chief Medical Officers' low-risk guidelines.

This includes **17%** of women and **27%** of men.



This compares to **20%** of people in Scotland who drink above the guidelines.

There were **123 alcohol-related hospital admissions** in the Orkney Islands in 2022-23.

The admission rate was similar to Scotland as a whole.

39% of 13-year-olds and **76%** of 15-year-olds in the Orkney Islands have drunk alcohol.

Of those who have ever drunk alcohol, **40%** of 13-year-olds and **71%** of 15-year-olds have been drunk.

Every year, alcohol costs the Orkney Islands **£6.30m** or **£313** per person.

This includes:

Health Service	£1.07m
Social Care	£0.95m
Crime	£1.60m
Productive Capacity	£2.67m

In the Orkney Islands, **2** people died because of alcohol in 2024, from conditions solely caused by alcohol.

The **true number** of alcohol deaths is **over twice as high** when including conditions such as cancer and cardiovascular diseases.
